 - Consult at beginning at beginning of next academic year
 - Agree position in Dec 2007 for Jan 2008
 - **Not policy**

Other policy decisions

- 
- MPharms delivered in part overseas
 - 1st 2 years
 - Foundation degrees: FdA over 2 years = Year 1 of MPharm
