- Provide high standard of care

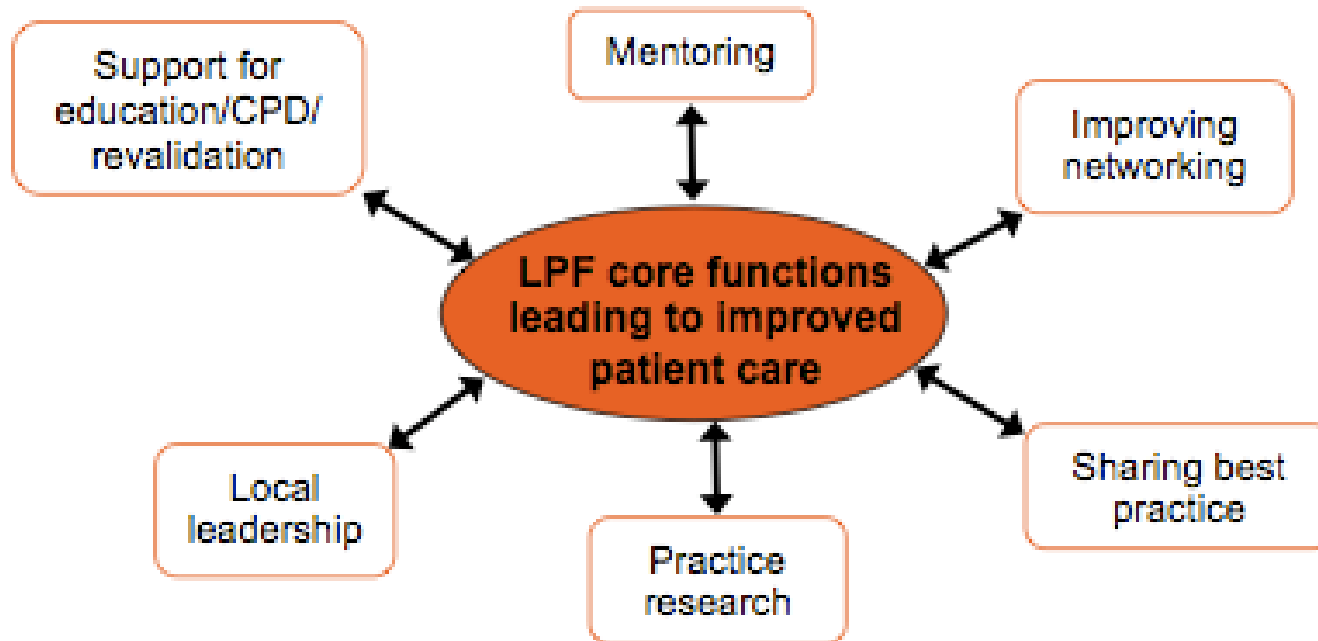
Reality Check
