Summary of an Independent Prescribing Conversion Accreditation Report

University of Chester

1. Summary and Conclusions

Following the submission of accreditation documents in December 2006, the reviewers recommend to Education Committee that the programme should be accredited by the Society for a period of three years. The reviewers complimented the university on the clarity of their application which was thorough and well set out. The reviewers were pleased to note that the arrangements for teaching pharmacists were in a multi-professional environment. The university will formally be informed of the Society's decision in due course.

2. Conditions

The reviewers recommend that accreditation by the Society should be subject to the following conditions which must be met by the time the first cohort of students complete the programme.

- 2a. The university must supply the Society with a copy of the communication and / or form sent to applicants requiring them to provide a statement of support from a medical practitioner that confirms their competence as a supplementary prescriber and also evidence of CPD. (criteria 1.2.3 and 1.2.5)
- 2b. The university must supply the Society with a copy of the supporting information pack provided to DMPs, in particular to confirm that they receive information which clarifies the DMP's role in assessment. The Society reserves the right to comment on this information. (criterion 1.3.7)

3. Recommendations

There were no recommendations for this accreditation event

The course will not formally be accredited until the accreditation panel's recommendations have been endorsed by the Society's Education Committee.

Satisfactory evidence was subsequently provided to meet the above conditions of accreditation; following this the programme was approved for accreditation by the Society's Education Committee for a period of three years.
