## **REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION IN ISRAEL**

Israeli law requires a licensing examination in Pharmacy for every graduate of a foreign school of pharmacy wishing to practise in Israel. The examination, of the MCQ type, is held in several languages bi-yearly. The qualification requirements for sitting for the examination and Practising Pharmacy in Israel are:

- a) resident status in Israel and hold an Israeli Identity Card;
- b) completion of a university pharmacy course and at approved institution.
- b) at least six months of practical experience after graduation from the University, or completion of these six months of practice in Israel;
- c) a Letter of Good Standing from the Society confirming your registration and good standing.

Registration in Israel takes place at the local Health District Offices. All applications should be submitted to these local offices written in Hebrew. For further information and details of the Local Health District Offices refer to the MOH's website at:
