

There follows the outcome of recent Inquiries heard before the Statutory Committee of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

Monday 19, Tuesday 20, Wednesday 21 and Thursday 22 September 2005:

1. In the resumed Inquiry into [Mr Rajiv Sarna](#) (Registration No. 76820) and [Sarna Enterprises Ltd](#) (Identification No. 1084216) the Committee resolved to direct the Registrar to remove Mr Sarna's name from the Register of Pharmaceutical Chemists. Under Section 11 of the Pharmacy Act 1954, this direction is not to take effect until the expiration of a period of three months from the date on which notice of removal is given or in a case where an appeal has been brought against the direction, until the appeal is determined or withdrawn. The Committee resolved to issue Sarna Enterprises Ltd with a reprimand.
2. In the new Inquiry into Mr Paul Crawford (Registration No. 92425) the Committee resolved to issue Mr Crawford with a reprimand.
3. In the resumed Inquiry into Mr Sanjay Patel (Registration No. 76827) ([determination 1](#), [determination 2](#)) the Committee resolved to issue Mr Patel with a reprimand.
4. In the resumed Inquiry into [Mr Rajesh Mistry](#) (Registration No. 91540) and The House of Mistry Ltd (Identification No. 1084647) the Committee resolved to direct the Registrar to remove Mr Mistry's name from the Register of Pharmaceutical Chemists. Under Section 11 of the Pharmacy Act 1954, this direction is not to take effect until the expiration of a period of three months from the date on which notice of removal is given or in a case where an appeal has been brought against the direction, until the appeal is determined or withdrawn. The Committee resolved to take no further action against The House of Mistry Ltd.
5. In the resumed Inquiry into Ms Lesley Day (Registration No. 68404) the Committee resolved to issue Ms Day with a reprimand.
