

There follows the outcome of recent Inquiries heard before the Statutory Committee of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

Monday 23, Tuesday 24, Wednesday 25 and Thursday 26 January 2006:

1. The new Inquiry into Mr Mustafa Hakimuddin Bhaiji (Registration no. 1050805) was adjourned to a future date.
2. In the resumed Inquiry into Miss Lubna Qayyum Khan (Registration no. 1057173) the Committee resolved to issue Miss Khan with a reprimand.
3. In the new Inquiry into [Mr Andrew Mortara](#) (Registration no. F357) the Committee resolved to adjourn until Monday 20th February 2006 to agree the terms of a written undertaking.
4. In the new Inquiry into [Mr Ramesh Mavji Patel](#) (Registration no. 90343) and [Judds \(Chemists\) Ltd](#) (Identification no. 1000754) the Committee resolved to direct the Registrar to remove Mr Patel's name from the Register of Pharmaceutical Chemists. Under Section 11 of the Pharmacy Act 1954, this direction is not to take effect until the expiration of a period of three months from the date on which notice of removal is given or in a case where an appeal has been brought against the direction, until the appeal is determined or withdrawn. The Committee resolved to take no further action in relation to Judds (Chemists) Ltd.
5. The resumed Inquiry into Mr Manherlal Keshavlal Shah (Registration no. 63471) and MAM International Ltd (Identification no. 1001688) was adjourned to a future date.
