

There follows the outcome of recent Inquiries heard before the Statutory Committee of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

Monday 22, Tuesday 23, Wednesday 24 and Thursday 25 May 2006:

1. The resumed Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against Mr Manherlal Keshavlal Shah (Registration no. 63471) and MAM International Ltd (Identification no. 1001688) was adjourned for the Committee to deliver their determination at a later date.
2. The Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against Mr Dinesh Parmar (Registration no. 74869) was adjourned for the Committee to deliver their determination at a later date.
3. The Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against Dr Lyndon Lien Sun Wou (Registration no. 67470) was adjourned to resume at a later date.
4. Following the Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against [Ms Ruxana Munshi](#) (Registration no. 82341), the Committee resolved to issue Ms Munshi with a reprimand. The Committee found proved the Council's allegation that the erroneous certification of prescription forms by Ms Munshi and/or her employees; the submission of these erroneously certificated prescription forms to the PPA for payment resulting in overpayment; and the failure to ensure that staff had the requisite knowledge, skills and fitness to perform work delegated to them, amounted to misconduct.
5. Following an application for restoration on behalf of [Mr Piyush Patel](#) (previous registration no. 76075), the Committee directed that Mr Patel should be restored to the Register.
6. Following the [Inquiry into a complaint](#) by the Council of the Society against [Mr Derek Michael Phillips](#) (Registration no. 75766), the Committee resolved to direct the removal of Mr Phillips name from the Register. The Committee found proved the Council's allegation that discrepancies in Viagra 50mg and 100mg stock; breaches of Regulation 19 of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations; breaches of the Misuse of Drugs Safe Custody Regulations; a failure to deal appropriately with Controlled Drugs (failure to segregate patient returns and date-expired stock); the supply of Sildenafil without a valid prescription; breaches of Regulation 6 of the Medicines Sale and Supply Miscellaneous Provisions Regulations 1980; and the condition of the pharmacy notwithstanding a warning from the Society Inspector, amounted to misconduct.
