

There follows the outcome of recent Inquiries heard before the Statutory Committee of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

Monday 23, Tuesday 24, Wednesday 25 and Thursday 26 April 2007:

1. Following an Inquiry into Mr [Rakesh Kumar Panesar](#) (Registration no. 72139), the Committee directed the removal of Mr Panesar's name from the Register, who: (1) on 8 June 2001 at Birmingham Magistrates' Court was convicted of (i) failing to comply with the requirements of an improvement notice under s21 of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, requiring him to carry out remedial works to repair defects, contrary to s33 (1) (g) of the 1974 Act; (ii) failing to comply with the requirements of an improvement notice under s21 of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, requiring him to carry out remedial works to repair defects to prevent rainwater penetration, contrary to s33 (1) (g) of the 1974 Act; (iii) failing to comply with the requirements of an improvement notice under s21 of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, requiring him to provide a hot water supply, contrary to s33 (1) (g) of the 1974 Act; and (2) on 23 May 2005 at Birmingham Magistrates' Court was convicted of (i) keeping or knowingly permitting the keeping of controlled waste without holding a waste management licence contrary to s33 (1) (B) (i) & (6) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990; (ii) failing to take all such measures available applicable to him in that capacity as were reasonable to prevent contravention by any other person, contrary to s34 (1) (A) and (6) of the 1990 Act. Under Section 11 of the Pharmacy Act 1954, the direction to remove Mr Panesar's name from the Register is not to take effect until the expiration of a period of three months from the date on which notice of removal was given or where an appeal has been brought against the direction, until the appeal is determined or withdrawn.
2. Following an Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against Mr [Gordon Trefor Cannell](#) (Registration no. 62697), the Committee decided to take no further action.
3. Following an Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society the Committee resolved to reprimand Miss Lindsay Wilson (Registration no. 83018). The Committee found proved allegations that Miss Wilson had failed to comply with Key Responsibilities 1 to 3 of the Code of Ethics and Standards.
4. Following an Inquiry, the Committee resolved to reprimand Mr [Kenneth Sanderson Brown](#) (Registration no. 1058800) who on 22 July 2004 was convicted at Hamilton Sheriff Court of driving a motor vehicle whilst unfit to drive through alcohol, contrary to s5 (1) (A) of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
