

Statutory Committee Inquiries

The Statutory Committee will meet at the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, 1 Lambeth High Street, London SE1, at 9.30am on Tuesday 25th, Wednesday 26th and Thursday 27th September 2007 to hear the following Inquiries:

1. The Committee will hear the new inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against [Mr Fatehali Abdalhussein Hassanali](#) (Registration no. 67479) which alleges that the supply of 210mls of Methadone 1mg/1ml sugar free mixture against a prescription calling for 120mls; a failure to take adequate steps to confirm the identity of the patient before making the above supply; recording a supply of 120mls in i) the Controlled Drugs Register for Methadone supplied, ii) the patient's instalment prescription and iii) the patient's Patient Medication Record, when Mr Hassanali knew that he had supplied 210mls; and following the above erroneous supply, a failure to i) take any or adequate steps to enquire about the patient's health and/or well being; ii) take any or adequate steps to recover the excess supply given to the patient; iii) inform Pharmacy staff or his employer of his conduct as set out above, may amount to misconduct.
2. The Committee will hear the new Inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against Mr Shiv Kumar Sharma (Registration no. 90720) which alleges that conduct contrary to: Part 2 A.1(a) of the Code of Ethics and Standards, in that he did not have the requisite fitness for the tasks to be performed; Key Responsibility 1 of the Code of Ethics and Standards, in that he did not at all times act in the interests of patients and other members of the public; Key Responsibility 2 of the Code of Ethics and Standards, in that he failed to ensure his performance was of a high quality; and Key Responsibility 3 of the Code of Ethics and Standards, in that he failed to adhere to accepted standards of personal and professional conduct and engaged in behaviour or activity likely to bring the profession into disrepute or undermine public confidence in the profession, may amount to misconduct.
3. The Committee will hear the new Inquiry into Mr Jonathan Maldwyn Smith (Registration no. 75431) who on 13 February 2002 at Southampton Magistrates' Court following a guilty plea, was convicted of driving a motor vehicle, namely a motor car, on a road after consuming so much alcohol that the proportion of it in his breath, namely 95 microgrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath, exceeded the prescribed limits, contrary to section 5(1)(A) Road Traffic Act 1988 and schedule 2 to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988.
4. The Committee will hear the new Inquiry into [Ms Joanna Claire Tisdale](#) (Registration no. 93523) who on 24 April 2006 in Wolverhampton Crown Court was convicted of 8 counts of theft.
